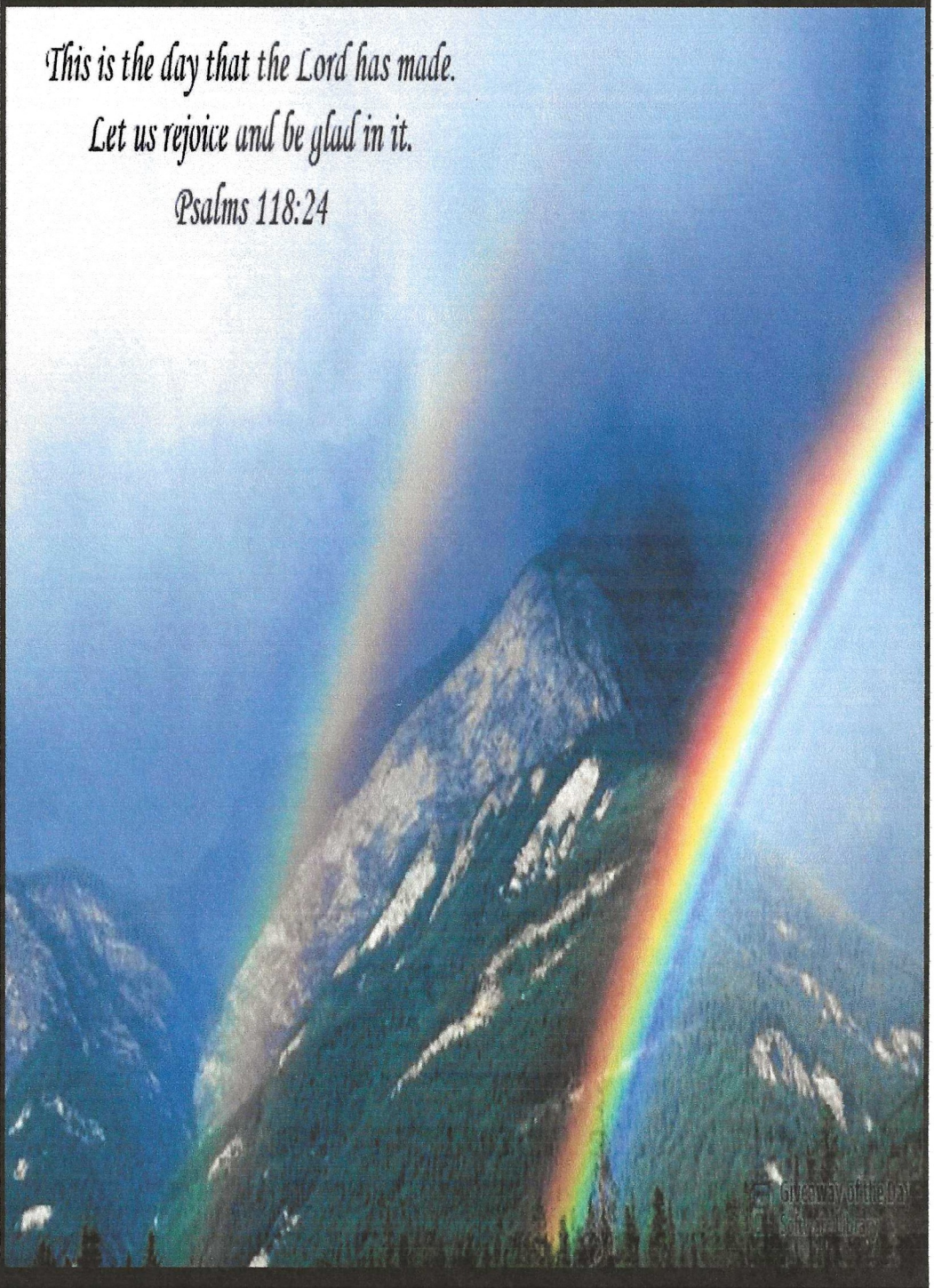

Jesus Himself said, "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me" (Matthew 16:24). And that, my friends is what we will do.

Anyway, since when did polltakers, market researchers, blog reporters, and pessimistic prognosticators determine the progress of the church. God's measure is rarely if ever the same as man's measure. Samuel was anointing the next king of Israel after Saul was removed in I Samuel 16:7. Samuel learned about God's perspective versus man's perspective. Read it. 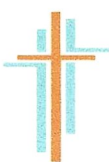
