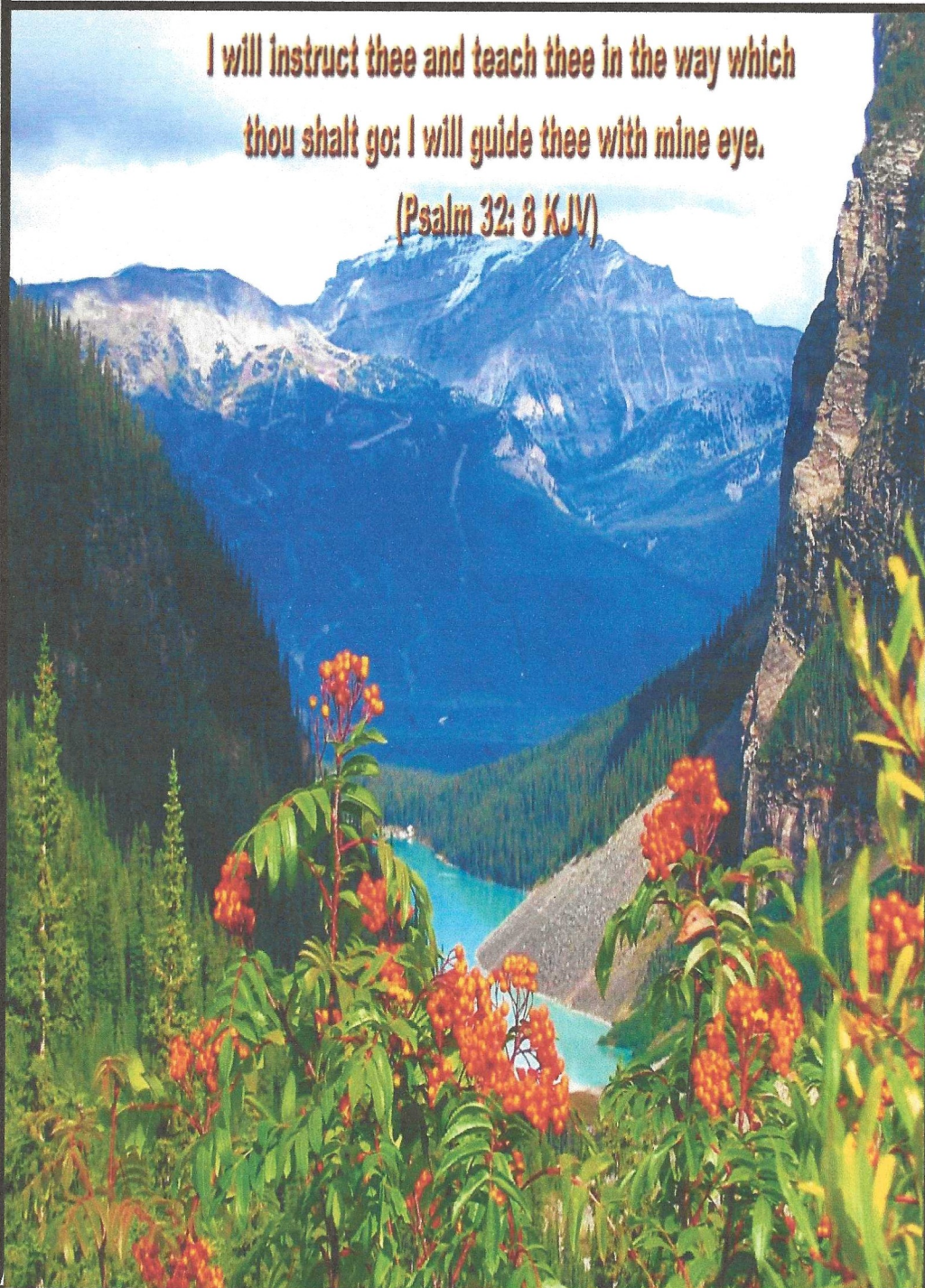

And we didn't always have a bat and a ball. Sometimes we had a stick and a rolled up wrapped up something held together with rubber bands. Ever played Hide and Seek? How about Mother May I? No? Then you haven't really lived! We did have an imagination, that's for sure. I'm glad things have changed. And I'm sad things have changed.

God doesn't change. He is the same, yesterday, today, and forever. God does change. He changes us, makes us better, stronger, wiser and readies us for all the changes that lie ahead. I'm excited about all that God has in store for us in the near and distant future. He knows.
