

We didn't always have a bat and a ball. Sometimes we had a stick and a rolled up wrapped up something held together with rubber bands. Ever played Hide and Seek? How about Mother May I? What about "school" with a rock and steps? No? We did have an imagination, that's for sure. I'm glad things have changed. And I'm sad things have changed.

God doesn't change. He is the same, yesterday, today, and forever. God does change. He changes us, makes us better, stronger, wiser and readies us for all the changes that lie ahead. I do not know what challenges and opportunities that are in the near and distant future. God knows. And I am so thankful for that. May God bless us all as we keep trusting and obeying Him every day.
